

**STATEMENT IN SUPPORT OF
A CONFIDENTIAL REQUEST FOR INVESTIGATION**

James R. Marsh, an attorney duly admitted to practice before the courts of the State of New York and the District of Columbia, hereby affirms under penalty of perjury that the following statement is true to his own personal knowledge, except as to matters stated on information and belief, and as to those matters he believes them to be true:

1. I have been the attorney for fourteen year old Masha Allen (a/k/a Masha Mancuso / Maria Mancuso / Masha Ginn) since August 3, 2005.
2. Masha was adopted from Russia at age five by a pedophile named Matthew Mancuso and subjected to extensive sexual abuse, including sadomasochism, starvation, and forced exhibitionism. Masha is pictured in hundreds of child pornography images which are highly sought by pedophiles worldwide. Her image sets are among the most popular in the world and are possessed by upwards of 60% of child predators apprehended in the United States and Canada.
3. On May 27, 2003, the Federal Bureau of Investigation [FBI] raided Mancuso's home looking for child pornography.
4. When the FBI found Masha at Mancuso's home, they contacted the Allegheny County Department of Human Services [DHS].
5. After Masha was evaluated by the Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, DHS placed her into the foster home of Families United Network [FUN] foster parent Lynn Ginn (a/k/a Faith Allen). FUN is a private child welfare agency contracted by DHS to provide foster care and adoption services.

6. At the time of Masha's placement, Ms. Ginn was [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] FUN [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] staff were reportedly told not to place children in her home. Before, during and after Masha's placement, FUN staff believed Ms. Ginn to be [REDACTED]
[REDACTED]
7. Even though Ms. Ginn was in the process of being terminated as a FUN foster parent, she incorrectly remained on FUN's available foster placement list. Ms. Ginn's home was wrongly deemed available to accept Masha since it was "closed."
8. When FUN staff discovered that Masha was placed with Ms. Ginn, they attempted to classify it as a temporary placement.
9. Almost immediately after arriving in Ms. Ginn's home, Masha's story was widely reported in the local news. Ms. Ginn enjoyed the notoriety and almost immediately began calling Masha "Masha Ginn."
10. By the end of June 2004, Ms. Ginn declared her intention to adopt Masha.
11. The termination of Mancuso's parental rights and Ms. Ginn's adoption of Masha was finalized in less than 11 months. At the time, the average wait in Allegheny County for an adoption to be finalized was 22 months. Nationally, the average wait for a 10 year old girl to be adopted from foster care was almost four years.
12. Prior to Ms. Ginn becoming a foster parent with FUN, she lived with Judge Cheryl Lynn Allen. The nature and scope of their relationship is detailed in the attached Pittsburgh Post-Gazette news story of May 14, 2004. [Exhibit 1]

13. During her employment by FUN, Ms. Ginn frequently discussed her friendship with Judge Allen with FUN staff. She spoke of dinners at Judge Allen's home and their close and personal relationship.
14. After Masha was placed in Ms. Ginn's home, Ms. Ginn reportedly told FUN staff that Judge Allen would speed up the adoption and do whatever was necessary to make the adoption happen quickly. She also reported that she was going to change her last name to Allen so she and Masha could have the Allen name.
15. On January 23, 2004, with the assistance and legal representation by Judge Allen's court attorney Elizabeth Lacy, Lynn Ginn changed her name to Faith Elizabeth Allen in Allegheny County docket GD-03-20845.
16. Upon information and belief, Elizabeth Lacy also helped Ms. Ginn complete the adoption petition and paperwork necessary to adopt Masha and served as her attorney in that matter.
17. On May 14, 2004, Judge Allen, sitting in the criminal court, presided at Ms. Ginn's adoption of Masha. The transcript of that proceeding is attached. [Exhibit 2]
18. On May 24, 2004, a letter to the editor appeared in the Post-Gazette praising Judge Allen as a national role model. [Exhibit 3]
19. In June 2004, Ms. Ginn made a videotape of her engaging in sexual activity with a minister at her home [REDACTED]
20. On October 21, 2004, the Allegheny County district attorney filed charges against the minister after Ms. Ginn claimed that she was hypnotized by the minister and sexually

molested during a pastoral counseling session in her home. See Allegheny County criminal docket CP-02-CR-0000569-2005.

21. By December 2004, Ms. Ginn and Masha, with Judge Allen's counsel and encouragement, relocated from Pittsburgh to rural Georgia.

22. In March and September 2006, Masha [REDACTED]

23. On September 27, 2006, I received the attached anonymous letter from Johnstown, Pennsylvania which alleges that a judge in Pittsburgh used her influence to help Ms. Ginn adopt Masha. [Exhibit 4]


24. In October and November 2006, the Georgia Department of Family and Children's Services [DFACS] investigated a report alleging that Ms. Ginn [REDACTED]

A tale of faith, hope and love blesses all

She got the call because her name began with "A," so she was first on the list.

Would Cheryl Allen be willing to take in a young woman who'd been in treatment for an eating disorder and was now searching for a job?

The call was from a fellow elder at Allen's church, Jubilee International Ministry in Plum, and she knew Allen, a juvenile court judge, wouldn't say no. The judge had been a foster parent, counseled young women on self-sufficiency and worked on the boards of non-profit groups.

And so the match was made. A young woman who had stopped eating after years of physical and sexual abuse at the hands of her parents moved into the home of a judge who'd spent a decade on the bench dealing with such cases.

She would stay only a few months until she got a job and a place of her own. But in that time, the two bonded as Allen soothed her night terrors, connected her to faith-based counseling and simply listened when she needed to talk.

They came to regard each other as mother and daughter.

In January, to honor that relationship and break from her past, the young woman changed her name to Faith Elizabeth Allen.

Faith would go on to follow in Allen's footsteps, caring for foster children.

One of them was an 11-year-old whom she affectionately calls Mea, a child like Faith who suffered horrible abuse and night terrors. Just as Judge Allen awoke Faith from the overwhelming nightmares, held her and read to her religious passages, Faith in turn comforted Mea.

They believe divine intervention brought them together to give Judge Allen, the mother of three boys, the daughter she never had and to give Faith and Mea the

help they needed.

It was three years ago that Faith went to live with Allen. The judge knew the young woman, then 24, had dropped to 70 pounds before getting treatment for anorexia at the Peniel Center in Johnstown.

But she didn't know of the abuse until the first time Faith suffered a night terror in her home.

Banging and screaming awoke the judge. She ran to Faith's room and found her crouching in a corner. Allen reached out to her. Still unconscious, Faith cringed.

When Allen awoke Faith, the young woman began to tell the story of a childhood destroyed by an alcoholic and physically abusive mother and a sexually predatory step-father. Faith went to foster care four times. Once she was abused there. But the last time, in a home where the foster mother's maiden name was Allen, she was treated well and not forced to return to her parents.

Still, she struggled, suffering a heart attack at age 17 because of the anorexia. Finally, at 21, she was referred to Peniel, a faith-based recovery center.

Eventually Faith met the church elder in Pittsburgh who asked Allen to take her in.

She stayed with Allen off and on for a couple of months until she found a job with a women's shelter and got a place of her own in the East End. After that, they talked, usually every day.

Allen helped her get counseling through Theotherapy Inc., a service for which Allen serves as a board member.

And Faith seemed to be recovering. Still, Allen worried when Faith decided to get certified as a foster parent because so many abused children end up as abusers.

But when the judge saw Faith with her first foster children, she knew it would be all right. "She has a deep capacity to love," the judge says, "If anything, my biggest concern now is that she wants to help everybody."

After she got her first foster children, Faith began attending Potters House Ministries in Braddock because of its programs for youngsters. Like Allen, the ministers there, Tyrone and Gloria Kemp, have embraced her as their own. Because of their kindness, she took her new middle name, Elizabeth, which means consecrated to God, at the suggestion of their daughter Tammie Brown.

Faith had two foster children when a caseworker called her a year ago asking if she'd take a third, a 10-year-old who'd been abused, starved and medically neglected and needed a home immediately.

Faith said she couldn't because she didn't have another bed. Just as she hung up, she got another call. A friend was moving and wanted to know if Faith could use bunk beds.

Faith said yes and quickly called the caseworker back. She would take Mea.

Just as when Allen agreed to take Faith in, Faith had no idea at that point how terribly Mea had been hurt. Faith believes God placed Mea with her because she could understand her pain and her needs.

"It is so awesome for her to be matched with a little girl of similar background who she is able to parent and minister to. I think it was by divine orchestration that it happened that way," Allen says. "And Mea reminds me so much of Faith. She has the sweetest, gentlest spirit."

Faith will never be able to bear her own children because of the abuse she suffered. But she will be a mother.

This afternoon, Faith Elizabeth Allen will adopt Mea. And officiating at the ceremony will be Judge Cheryl Allen.




