On 11/01/2018, Arabella (7) disclosed her foster parents do not allow her to have candy and kept her from school on Halloween (10/31/2018). The next days she went to ESS. The child had candy. Brian arrived and found out she had candy. He aggressively picked the child off the ground and put her down on her side. The child was crying, screaming and kicking. He pinned her down and tried to get into her pockets. This happened for 2-3 minutes. He was asked to leave by a third party because other children were present. He then dragged the child outside as she was kicking and screaming. The RP is unsure if she had had injuries. When at home the child said that Brian made her take her pants off and put her in the shower standing up and dumped cold water on her. The RP is unsure if it was down by both foster parents. The RP is aware that is not the first time they did this. The RP said they don't put bruises on her, but they do other things as such that is mentally abusive. That night the child said she could not eat with everyone and she was feed late by herself. She was tired and almost feel asleep. The only food she got was bean. The RP said the child is always hungry. The child is afraid of her parents because they treat her in such a manner.

The RP is concerned that the child only wares two outfits to school and her shoes smell. She has a shirt and jeans that she wears multiple days in a row. The child said her clothes have been take away and she has to "earn them back." The child said also for punishment that she has been made to sleep on the floor. It is unknown when this last occurred.

The RP said the child is afraid of the parents as they have "twisted her mind." They do not let her participate in things at school. She cannot play with other children and stays in the room for recess. She is give a dixie cup and can only drink two of them with water when at school. She can only use the restroom once at school and not allowed to go any time. The RP said this has been set in place at school by the parents. Also, the child cannot use scissor and has to spit on paper to tear it.

The RP said the child is extremely smart, but the parent are making life hard for her. The RP said the child begged her not to tell anyone what has been happening to her because she is fearful of what might happen to her when she is at home.

When asked regarding further impact to the child, the RP said the child is always fearful of what the consequences will be at home regarding what she does. The RP said she is not a normal child as she has prior trauma, but what is happening in the home now is not health for the child mental and physical well-being.

PSW Freeman received a telephone call from the mother, Leticia McCormack, on the current date. The mother stated that she is aware that there was a report regarding the school incident. The mother stated that she and the father are able to meet with this worker right away in Mission Valley. PSW Freeman informed the family that this worker is unable to meet at this time but requested to come to the home on tomorrow following visiting the school. The mother stated that she had a meeting with the school on today, and Arabella will be home schooled under the school district starting today. The mother stated that Arabella has requested to be home schooled and they did not initially due to her behaviors and needing services through the school. The mother stated that there have been too many issues with the school and Arabella has been requesting to not go to the school. The mother stated

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that the father is present and would like to speak with this worker regarding the incident.

The father stated that on the day of the incident he went to pick up the child, Arabella; she was sitting aside from the group in the afterschool program. The father stated that the teacher said that the child refused to respond when he prompted her to give him the candy that she had so she was excused from participating in afterschool program today. The father stated that the child knows that she is not allowed to have candy and the teacher should also be aware because it is part of her 504 plan. The teacher stated that the child was combative towards him and would not follow directions. The father stated that he went to the child and asked her to give him the candy and she started yelling and took off running. The father stated that he got the child to return back to the gym area near the stage and the child would still not respond or give him the candy. The father stated that he picked the child up regularly with both of his hands under her under arms and lifted her onto the stage. The father stated that the child started to kick at him so he was holding her legs down and pinning her down so that she could not kick him. The father stated that the teacher asked that they leave at that point so the father stated that they left. The father stated that they left the school on the day of the incident and returned home like normal and when the child removed her clothes and put on her pajamas he found several candy wrappers in her pockets. The father stated that the mother was present at the home when this happened. The father stated that the child stated that her teacher gave her a candy bar and lots of candy. The father stated that nothing like this has ever happened before, and he does not physically abuse the child. The father stated that he was trying to handle the incident at school to address it there and squash it but the child was upset and combative. The father stated that the child was able to calm down once they returned home. This worker asked the father how he generally handles the child when she has an outburst, and the father stated that the child is usually sent to her room to calm down and then they discuss what happen once the child is ready to talk. The mother stated that also the child has a lot of dental issues and fruits and sugar in acidic foods are currently for bidden by the dentist. The mother stated that they are trying to find ways to help the child without having her take medication and that is why they have begun looking at her foods that she is eating. The mother stated that the child's anxiety is affected by food as well and the child has history of constipation. The mother stated that they are trying to control the outburst and aggressive behavior through food instead of medication because they have found that she is calmer when she has an appropriate diet. The mother stated that they also frequently have the child take a nap when she is acting out or being aggressive because it calms her mcod.
